Wirral Circular Trail Litter Pick

Saturday 5th & Sunday 6th June 2021

Aim:

For the Rotary Clubs around the Wirral, along with other partners, to 'litter pick' the whole of the Wirral Circular Trail over the weekend of Saturday 5th and Sunday 6th June 2021.

Objectives:

The Trail will be divided into zones (17 zones of 2 miles) and shared between the Wirral Rotary Clubs. Clubs will work with local partners, eg litter picking groups and other trail users, to collect rubbish. This will allow for development of relationships between Rotary Clubs, partner organisations and individuals.

The weekend project will be publicised locally through news and social media, and will be reported through Rotary magazines and online media.

Desired End Result:

- ◆ Wirral Circular Trail cleared of rubbish
- ◆ Rotary visibly active (hi viz jackets etc to be worn)
- ◆ Development of relationships / networking with other community groups and individuals
- ◆ Publicity across Wirral and beyond
- ◆ Recruitment of new members
- ◆ Sense of achievement

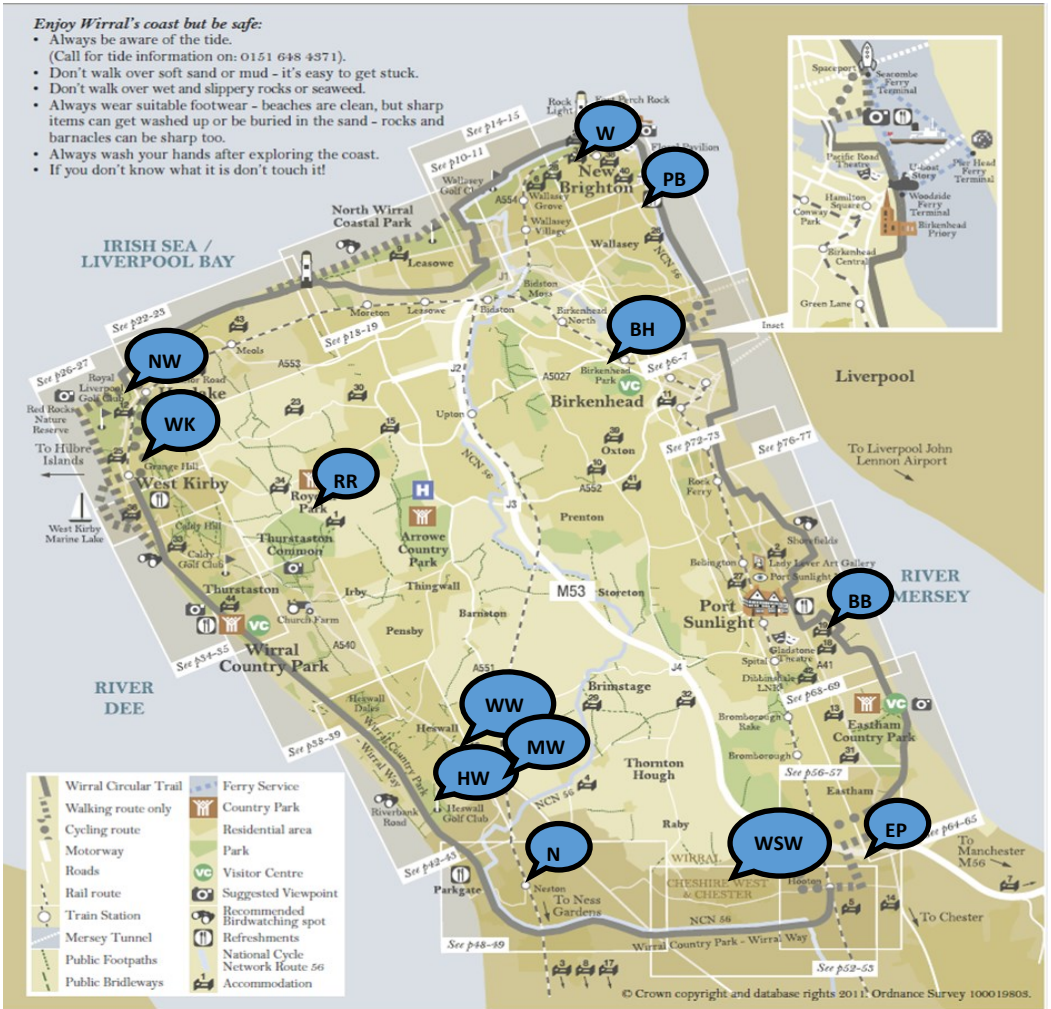
What Has To Be Done

- 3: Leasowe, Pasture Road–Roman Rd, Meols (2 miles)
- 4: Roman Rd, Meols–Hoylake Red Rocks (2 miles)
- 5: Hoylake Red Rocks–West Kirby Sailing Club (2 miles)
- 6: West Kirby Sailing Club–Thurstaston (2 miles)
- 7: Thurstaston–Delavor Road (2 miles)
- 8: Delavor Road–Boathouse Lane, Parkgate (2 miles)
- 9: Boathouse Lane, Parkgate–Lees Lane, Neston (2 miles)
- 10: Lees Lane, Neston–Hadlow Road, Willaston (2 miles)
- 11: Hadlow Road, Willaston–Lowfields Ave (2 miles)
- 12: Lees Lane, Neston–Eastham Country Park (2 miles)
- 13: Eastham Country Park–Riverbank Rd/Thermal Rd (2 miles)
- 14: Riverbank Rd/Thermal Rd –Proctor Rd/New Chester Rd (2 miles)
- 15: Proctor Road/New Chester Rd–Wirral Magistrates Court (2 miles)
- 16: Wirral Magistrates Court–Seacombe Ferry (2miles)
- 17: Seacombe Ferry–New Brighton Marine Lake Car Park (2 miles)
